

Online Resources for Virtual Engagement

There are a host of online resources for adult learning covering workforce skills. We attempted to highlight just a few sources that allow customers to learn remotely either using an online portal or through print materials. This document organizes it based on Career Exploration and Planning, Work Readiness Skills and High School Equivalency/Adult Basic Education.

Lessons cover communication skills, workplace basics, job success, and business communication. Students will learn "what's expected of you as a new employee, how to complete paperwork, what you need to know about benefits and time off, and more." Each module ends in a quiz at the end to test knowledge.
