

INTERVIEWING "DO'S"

BEFORE THE INTERVIEW

- Make your social media private.
- Have a Plan A & a Plan B for your childcare and transportation for the interview.
- Have a short, professional voicemail message on your phone.
- Be ready to take a drug test.
- Attend one of our Interview Workshops by logging in at <u>www.detroitatwork.com</u> and going to the Workshops tab.
- Have 3 professional references in writing.
- Know at least three things about the Employer/do some research (For example: type of industry, Company's mission, and length of time in business)
- Know your resume be prepared to talk about your past work experiences in detail.
- Prepare at least one question to ask at the end of the interview.
- Practice the interview with someone.
- Print 5 copies of your resume and put in a nice folder to bring to the interview.
- Practice your transportation route to interview beforehand.
- Plan your outfit we usually recommend you wear business or business casual but contact the Detroit at Work staff who helped you get the interview if you're unsure what to wear
- Confirm your childcare and transportation (i.e., make sure you have gas in your car, try on your clothes).

DURING THE INTERVIEW

- Arrive at the interview site 30 minutes early.
- Go to the bathroom when you get there to check your appearance.
- Turn off your phone.
- Make eye contact with employer throughout the interview.
- Let the interviewer lead the conversation.
- Smile and be enthusiastic.
- Be confident but also humble.
- Ask about the next step in the hiring process at the end of the interview.
- Ask for a business card before you leave so you can send a thank you email/follow up.

AFTER THE INTERVIEW

- Send a thank you note or email after the interview.

INTERVIEWING "DON'TS"

- Don't bring food or drinks to the interview.
- Don't bring your children or anyone else to the interview.
- Don't wear headphones.
- Don't check your phone while in the interview (in fact, turn your phone off).
- Don't chew gum.
- Don't smoke in the car on the way there or the parking lot (you don't want to smell like smoke!).
- Don't talk about your children or other personal matters.
- Don't talk negatively about previous employers, managers, coworkers.
- Don't talk about pay or benefits in first interview.
- Don't rush your answers pause and think before responding. Ask if you need clarification about a question asked.
- Don't refer someone else to the job until you are hired.
- Don't cancel the interview to attend another one.
- Don't be a no-show if an emergency comes up, reschedule in advance as soon as you know you have a conflict.
